

#### **Program**

Our program chair, Mel Pearson, explains that State Senator Lois Wolk had to cancel her speaking engagement, this morning, as she is suffering from laryngitis. So, she sent Catherine Baxter, her Solano County Field Representative, to speak at our meeting.

Catherine begins by letting us know that she'll be glad to forward our questions to Sen. Wolk. Her talk focuses on CA water issues. Sen. Wolk is the current majority whip, and she's chair of the budget committee. Catherine says the state legislature has been productive the past 2 years, with a balanced budget passed on time each year, possibly resulting from the

temporary tax increase of 2012.

A new water bond, which passed with a 67% vote, affects both ground and surface water, including new storage funding (Los Vaqueros Reservoir.) She says the bond is "BDCP neutral." BDCP (Bay and Delta Protection Commission) is a euphemism for the twin 40' tunnels.

Catherine also discussed Props. 1 & 2, addressing end of life issues. Polls are showing wide support. She requests that we let the senator know our thoughts on this important issue.
