Betty introduces our speaker, Sid Leutholtz, whose parents built the Rio Sands Hotel in 1964. Sid is the 2015 Potentate-Elect for the Ben Ali Shriners. He talks about the Shriners Children's Hospital in Sacramento.

Sid, who lives in Lodi, reminisces about Rio Vista, recalling such old time Rio Vistans as Harvey, Hank, Evelyn, Jim Lira and Betty. He shows us a video telling about the works of all Shriners Children's Hospitals.

These hospitals not only treat kids in a comfortable, non-threatening environment using the latest technologies, but they also conduct vigorous research and development programs geared specifically for their youthful patients. There are 22 such hospitals, here, in the U. S., with the Sacramento facility being their flagship unit.

The Shriners raise the money to pay for these hospitals, with insurance companies footing a portion of the bill. Operational costs for all of the hospitals are \$850M/year, with Sacramento costing \$57M/year. 50/50 Raffle
