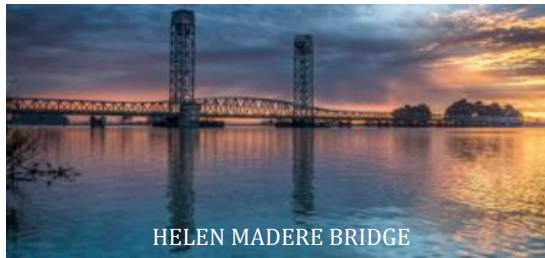




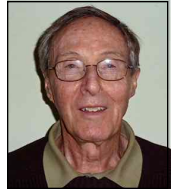

Program

Today, Al Hartford gives talk on American Corporate Partners (ACP), a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization dedicated to assisting U. S. veterans in transition from the military to civilian world. The organization, founded in 2008, connects veterans to business professionals for mentoring, career counseling and networking.

The idea is to minimize additional training necessary for an individual to resume their chosen career field as a civilian. Their website, acp-advisornet.org, can be utilized to match veterans' skills with a company needing employees with those skills. Job seekers can post their profiles online, and employers can search them.

There, veterans can ask experts about career development, get advice on resumes and interviewing, and receive tips about building a small business.

Al explains that currently, vets must start their education from square one when they enter the civilian work force. So, although they were trained to do nursing and emergency medical technician duties in the military, they must take the entire training over again to do the same work as a civilian.

Jim McCracken announces that right here in Rio Vista, high school kids 16 years or older who are looking for employment such as clerical work, life guards, etc., may go online

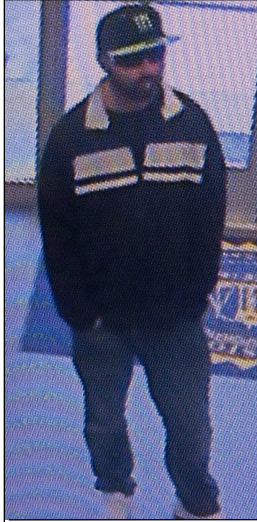
