Program

Jim Lira says when Ski Thomson first ran for Supervisor, he asked to place a campaign display at Lira's. To avoid the political fray, Jim resourcefully suggested using the contiguous lot next door, instead. And the rest is history.

Skip opens saying he won't forget Rio Vista. He's appeared before our Council and he holds office hours here to assist us with issues.

The county's 2012-13 budget projection was a \$4.7M deficit. So far, they're in the positive about \$2M and may end up with zero structural deficit. They're grappling with pension reform and the affordable health care act, which takes effect next January.

At the end of this year there will be about \$40M left to finance next year, which is a good thing. The county coffers were bolstered by \$8M this year by the curtailment of the redevelopment agencies, and property values are recovering.

Although CalPERS (Public Employees Retirement System) changes will be costly in the short term, cost savings will result in the long term.

Skip discusses BDCP (Bay Delta Conservation Plan) and Jerry Meral's infamous statement that the delta can't be saved. He describes "tunnel muck" the huge amount of dirt resulting from digging the tunnels that would cover 1600 acres 100' deep. Put it in the borrow pits. Yuk, yuk. Ed.

Sheriff Tom Ferrara took over when Gary Stanton retired in November. He started at RVPD and worked for Sheriff Al "Pat" Cardoza.

Tom discusses the problems of realignment and early release of state prison inmates. The county jails don't have exercise yards and other facilities to handle long term prisoners.

It costs \$150 a day, or \$100K a year to house prisoners, and the recidivism (repeat offenders) rate is at 70%. With AB900 funding, a new 362 bed maximum security facility at Clay Bank will need fewer staff members by utilizing new technologies. 50/50 Raffle
