holes on one of the Brentwood courses to build a strip mall, but that did not materialize. For 3 years he did nothing to maintain the Rio Vista course. He then unsuccessfully tried to sell the course to the Home Owners Ass'n. at Trilogy for \$1.1M. A Trilogy resident, Don Love, put together a loan from Bank of R. V. that would have cost the homeowners \$7.34 per home per month. There were 1834 homes, then, and the course would have been paid off, this year.

The Home Owner's board turned over, and the course owners then offered to sell the course for \$650K, but the new board wouldn't respond to the offer. Then, Warrior bought the course but didn't maintain it and filed for bankruptcy. The board has now purchased the course for slightly over \$1M.

They've hired Course Co, a reputable company, to manage the course, and renovation work is now underway. The entire irrigation system, including 1800 sprinkler heads at \$100 apiece, lawn mowers, computer system, TV's in the bar, janitorial services, management, golf carts, drainage systems, uniforms, office and kitchen equipment are being revamped.
