

Rio Vision Presents Improvement Project for the Promenade!





Rio Vision comes to update us on the continued efforts to bring more businesses and tourism to our quaint river town. This organization is responsible for our new dog and skate park to which many of our town residents have been taking advantage of over the past year. What a great way to give kids somewhere to gather and be active. Then of course, there's the dog park for all of our dog lovers in the area to let their precious pooch run free along with their four legged friends.

Today Rio Vision presented a new project to our club for continued upgrades to the Promenade Area just off Front St. They'd like to install a "Four Point Sail" to cover the massive concrete area. By doing so, there would be the opportunity to hold major events under it, such as weddings, concerts, community bbq, and farmers markets. Now what would this cost the town of Rio Vista? Well, they have a plan for that. The total cost would be \$200,000. As of now they have raised \$20,000 and are waiting for a few grants to come in from American Academy of Dermatology in the amount of \$8,000. If we as a town can raise another \$20,000 then we are eligible for a grant to cover the balance.
